## **Pre-Preparation**

Learner driver Needs: (Discussion with the supervising driver and learner driver to determine lesson content)

During the previous lesson we learnt about Steering. For this lesson we will recap on Steering Techniques.

We will then focus on Changing Gears for this lesson.

#### **Lesson Preparation**

The student will need to be able to steer the well enough to keep the car in a straight line and negotiate the line and negotiate the corners encountered.

Light traffic situations will be used as well as quiet areas for any steering maneuvers.

**Revision** and basic knowledge test about this lesson topic

Suggested time: 5 minutes

How long should you signal before you move away from the kerb?
What mirror checks should you make before you move away from the kerb?
What is the minimum safe gap to move into when moving away from the kerb?

#### Learning Goal:

To Change gears smoothly and efficiently to suit road conditions, speed and vehicle requirements.

**Main Body** (Recap of previous topic, if applicable)

Suggested time: 45 minutes

Reasons for learning - The importance of the knowledge and skills to be learnt: (Instructor Tip: Engage the learner by challenging, paraphrasing and encouraging them to reflect on the lesson content)

- o The purpose of this lesson is to teach you the correct use of the vehicle's gears, gear lever and clutch.
- As a driver, you will need to be able to select the correct gear to suit the driving conditions in a safe and effective manner, within the law and as laid down by the guidelines
- Efficient gear change, timing and co-ordination, ensures that the driver has safe and effective control over the vehicle.

By the end of the lesson the learner will be able to understand and operate the following:

- ✓ Identify the position and use of the Gear Lever
- ✓ Co-ordinate the Clutch, Accelerator and Gear Lever
   ✓ Change Up and Down gears according to the speed
- ✓ Brake and change down gears to prepare for a corner
